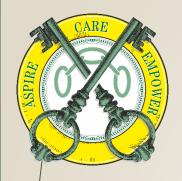

We are also extremely approachable and can be caught at the end of school should you have any questions or concerns.



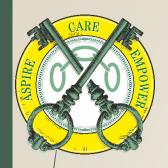
A Typical Day

- Arrival-8.45 Living streets tracker and register/lunches
- Morning activity-spelling related. Wordshark or phonics
- Lessons- 9.15-10.30 Maths (except on Fridays)
- -/ Break time
- Lessons- 10.45-12.00 English.
- Reading 12-12.30
- Lunch time- first in, always a bonus!
- Afternoon lessons 1.30-2.45
- Daily Mile on days when there isn't PE
- Collective Worship- daily from 2.45-3.05
- Home time- 3.20



Day to Day Routines

- Water bottles are allowed on tables water only please and non-spill lids
- Pencil cases are not required in school but should fit in a tray
- Mobile phones none on site ideally must be switched off and handed to staff on arrival where they will be kept in a tray throughout the day
 - Walking home/end of the day- please inform your class teacher in advance
- Healthy snack- fresh fruit or veg only please



Attendance

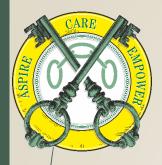
Arrival time: between 8.45am and 8.55am (gates open at 8.40am) Please drop and collect from the other side of the wall (aids independence) Pick up time is 3.20pm-children will be taken up to the office if you're running late so don't panic.

Punctuality: children will be given a late mark between 8.55am and 9.20am. After 9,20am they will be given a 'U' mark (unauthorised absence for the session).

Absences: please communicate daily with the school office giving clear reasons for absence (e.g. 'high temperature and earache', not 'ill') if you could do this on a daily basis it saves office time

Leave of absence: need to complete a form and send in to office. New guidance in August 2024 means that term-time holidays are only approved in 'exceptional circumstances'.

Curriculum Highlights

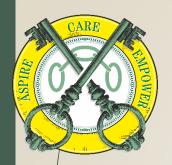
This term:

Reading in Year 5/6

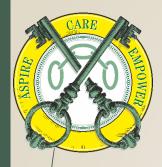
Ideally, we anticipate that children should still be reading for approximately 20 minutes a day at home.

deductive skills.



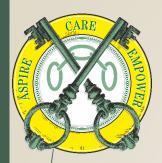
PE

and collected on a Monday



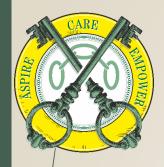
Things to Come

Communication

- Formal Parents' Evening in autumn and spring term (online booking system)
- Progress, attainment, effort and attendance reports at the end of autumn and spring terms (emailed to parents)
 - End of year school report (emailed to parents)
 - Parent Share in the Autumn and the Spring term: an hour after school to come into class with your child to look through their work with them.
- Celebration Evening in the summer term: an extended evening session to come into class with your child to look through their work with them; can also visit new class to meet new teachers.



Communication

- Seesaw-a platform for us to share information with you, and you can also message us. You should also receive weekly updates and homework pages via this platform
- Fortnightly newsletters on the school web site and facebook site where we share news, upcoming events and dates.
- School website: policies, dates and other information about the school.
- Termly parent forums- all are welcome

How to Help at Home

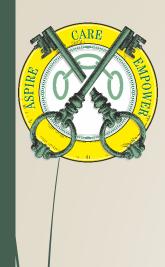
Reading strategies – questions about the book, don't just focus on fluency as comprehension is key.

Homework support- some of the CGP activities are a little tricky, encourage your children to show their working out (in Maths) and explain their methods.

Times tables- keep practising them so they know them in the inverse

Fractions- there's a huge focus on this in Years 5 & 6 which is why times table recall/understanding is imperative

Descriptive Writing - short piece with editing - <u>Pobble 365</u>, <u>Once</u> <u>Upon a Picture</u>
