




YOUNG VOICES





Go Global recently took part in the RSPB's Big Schools' Birdwatch, a nationwide citizen science project involving schools across the UK. Wrapped up warm, we spent time outdoors enjoying nature while observing and recording the birds around us. The most common birds we spotted were gulls, but we were pleased to see a wide range of different species too. We will be submitting our findings to the RSPB, where the data helps scientists understand bird populations and changes in wildlife over time. Taking part in this research is important as it supports conservation efforts and helps protect birds and their habitats for the future.



FOSP update

Last term was a fantastic one for FOSP and none of it would have been possible without your support. We raised over £15,000, donated nearly £18,000 to the school, and spent £610 helping families through our Helping Out Fund.

The Helping Out Fund
