It might have been more rainy than snowy in our part of the country this week but Mulberry have created these excellent Jack Frost chilly pictures.




KS1

Olive class started some work on expressive painting this week and have been experimenting with different tools and techniques. They even tried using a fork to do some painting!




Oak class wrote some Cinquain poems in English this week and have now created these beautiful second drafts. As you can see, the theme was insects.
