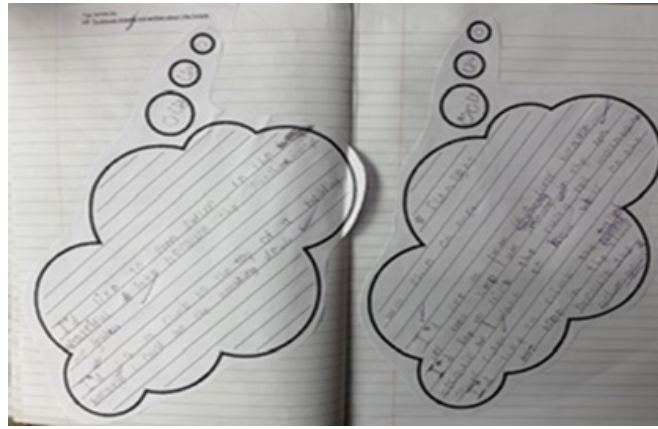
Reception
